Minutes of the last meeting

Matters arising

Mr Treadwell reported back on the progress made towards the installation of broadband in the village. Feedback is awaited from BT following correspondence from Mr Treadwell. If BT agreed to include Ashbury in its broadband rollout it would be unlikely Ashbury would need to pay anything towards the cost of broadband installation. Further updates expected in due course.

Following further complaints regarding Upper Mill and parking in particular, Mr Treadwell and Mrs Leon agreed to contact Mr and Mrs Higgins again to try and resolve the situation.

Bus tokens are being withdrawn by the VWHDC. It was agreed the clerk should draft and send a letter of complaint to the council expressing concern at the cuts.

A discussion ensued concerning access to the green at Kingstone Winslow.

It was noted and agreed that:

The parish council was granted formal possession of the green in 1967 (with certification granted in 1972).

A contribution to the discussion from Mr Hamilton Davies showed part erosion of the green over the years, given over to parking areas/access areas to certain properties on the green. His main point was to show change of use by default, which could also apply in his particular request for some parking area on the green.

Mr Treadwell suggested the allocation of formal parking ‘spaces’ by whatever means (lines, dots, stones etc) near to the green, which would perhaps present an amicable solution to the problem. It was agreed the clerk should obtain guidance on the allowed size of parking spaces from the Highways Department and report back before the next meeting.

Opinions regarding parking in the area of the green will also be sought from neighbours as to a possible solution.

The clerk will notify the highways department of several pot holes in the parish roads, including those in Chapel Lane, on Idstone Road by Rectory Farm and outside the Rose & Crown.

Following further complaints from the residents of the bungalows in Pound Piece, the clerk will remind Mr Peter Read of the need to plant the trees outside the new farm building on Station Road.

Marion Turner offered to organise an informal litter clearance after the Easter break. It was agreed the council would pay for the necessary litter bags, gloves etc. MT to coordinate in due course.
